
New UCU Prison Education Campaign

UCU is launching a major campaign to push for urgently needed changes in prison education. Despite you turning around the lives of learners, you are poorly-paid, have to deal with layers of contract compliance, poor CPD opportunities and unsustainable rates of attrition. The result is a loss of expertise, a narrow cost-driven curriculum, increased over-working and rising levels of attacks on staff.

The funding model is broken – diverting resources away from delivering truly meaningful education. The current PEF contract and the new PES contract fail learners and staff alike. HM Treasury is still refusing to confirm the application of Fair New Deal for prison educators' pensions. Most prison educators work for an FE college. FE has been reclassified as part of the public sector and our members' pensions should be protected like other public sector workers.

Pay compares poorly with secondary schools and FE colleges despite similar qualifications needed to teach inside.

Prisons are not safe – with reduced numbers of prison officers and a risk to prison educators from the use of harmful substances in prisons. See overleaf what UCU is calling for.

A comprehensive review of the current operation of the Prison Education Framework

The PES to be overseen by the Department for Education and run as a national prison education service on a not-for-profit basis.

A comprehensive review of the recommendations from the Coates review to inform these current proposals

The implementation of the Joint Unions in Prisons Alliance recommendations and safer prisons

A national contract for prison education staff and professional respect and parity of esteem with FE

HM Treasury to confirm the application of Fair New Deal as a matter of urgency
